on the gas, spin the car, haul freight, and slide," said George Ferrell referring to the autocross sponsored by the Virginia Motor Sports Club.

Autocrossing consists of three runs that are each about a minute long. Cars race along an old airstrip or a parking lot about half a mile long between pylons reaching speeds beyond 130 miles per hour.

"It's like a drug addiction. so many people spend so much time and money fixing up their cars for a quick rush. People live for autocrossing," said Mike Weedon.

#### More skill than speed

Rallying, on the other hand, is a three to four hour event and involves following carefully worded instructions. "It's a more cere-

bral process than a speed competition and both driver and navigator rely on one another to drive over public roads to the finish.

"For either type of race you can come out and compete in your family sedan and be just as competitive because we have around seventeen different classes for automobiles," said Neal Dickinson, president of the VMSC.

Fees for memberships in car clubs are about \$25 per year. Be prepared to join a group diverse of people that include everyone from restaurateurs, executives and doctors to mechanics.

According to Dickinson, who has been a member since 1966, "the membership is as varied as the type of cars out there."

## Rally Report

#### Tea for 2

The Sunday, June 18 "Tea for 2" Rally OD'ed by Mike Weedon and Marvin Mills turned out to be an extremely enjoyable event, although the distressingly small turnout of only six cars was very disappointing. The rally itself was clean and challenging, the weather perfect, and the picnic at Andy and Mimi Siffs at the end delightful. If you weren't able to make it, here's what you missed:

The Rally: About 90 competetive miles, plus a 10 mile Odo Check and a 2 mile run-in. Traps were of medium to slightly harder difficulty, but were error-free and well failsafed. In hindsight, they may have been a little too difficult for the majority of the field, but that's always a tough judgment call when the entrants aren't known in advance. The first Leg featured a non-standard 'T' definition which required that your Route must end at such an intersection. Not noticing this in the Generals cost about 100 points. Leg Two instructed that you turn left "if at a T', which of course meant that you should change Route at the first opportunity, whether at a T or not. An error here was worth a max.

Two more classic VMSC traps were used for Legs Three and Four - the "most nearly R" which was actually an L, and the "L where Route ends" which did not necessarily refer to the Route on which you were traveling. Both traps provided late errors if not correctly interpreted. Leg Five called for a "L after "STOP" where the STOP was in quotes within the instruction, and could therefore be from any sign along the rally course - it was, in fact, from a "SCHOOL BUS STOP AHEAD" sign. Leg Six utilized a twist on the "T" definition already employed in Leg One, but this time not requiring a course change - just a timing difference. Finally, the DIY Leg made use of what is becoming almost a VMSC obligatory trap, the distinction between "at" and "onto". You were told to go "L at a Route whose number contains the digit 1", and should, of course, have gone L to leave Route 631 as well as to get onto it, since you were at it in both cases. It would appear from the results that three of the six cars probably did this one wrong.

The Picnic: Great, as is everything which involves food, drink, and the Siffs. Andy's an Mimi's hospitality at their home was as enjoyable as it's been previously at their Ironhorse restaurant, and the company was congenial, if diminutive. At the risk of seeming too pushy, let us once again exhort those of you who haven't given the rally program a try to do so - if you really don't like the rallying aspect, at least you're sure to like the picnic. Organizing these events, and hosting the post-event social activities, involve a lot of time, thought, and expense. Those members who are willing to commit themselves to the considerable effort of putting them on deserve the support of all of us.







We hope to see everyone at the next autocross and bring a friend.





































#### **FAMILY PICNIC** A REPORT

The whole day was a load of fun, even with the HOT weather, and everyone had a great time. Many thanks to the Weirs for a really great party and for just putting up with all of us.





# Amateurs race anything on 4 wheels

## Drivers at 'autocross' roll their own dreams

HOPEWELL — By 10:30 a.m. yesterday, the air over the weedy, little-used Fort Lee airstrip was already shimmering when the first car its engine roaring and tires smoking — careened through a series of rubber traffic cones.

"This is my release on the weekends," said Robert McIntosh, a printer in real life and a race car driver yesterday. Actually, he was a race truck driver — in the same pickup truck that takes him to work each day.

But while shade along this stretch of state Route 725 was scarce, there was plenty of fun, noise and competition for more than 50 amateur drivers of the Virginia Motor Sports Club, Inc. who participated in yesterday's "autocross" event.

A dozen or so times a year the club, affiliated with the Sports Car Club of America, holds an autocross, a rally for members.

"The public is welcome. The more people we have the better we like it. Everyone out here is of a like mind and is enjoying themselves," said

"Anything with four wheels is eligible," with the exception of high-riding four-wheel-drive vehicles prone to tipping. Helmets are required for all participants and several are on hand for loan to those who do not own one.

This is racing for amateurs, would-be race car drivers who otherwise may never, for lack of time or resources, realize their dreams.

The cars on hand yesterday ran the gamut from antiques to expensive, late-model, exotic

imports. Off-the-lot cars used to take the kids to school were on the same track with highly-modified cars built for racing only.

The vehicles are grouped in classes to keep the competition as fair as

McIntosh organized yesterday's race and designed the course. "It's a course laid out on an open area, be it a parking lot, or like this, it's an airstrip." The courses vary depending on the location, he said.

Like many racers yesterday, McIntosh said he does not know the top speed he hits on courses. "I don't look at the speedometer. I'm too busy with what I'm doing to see how

fast I go."
"It's pretty much what your pocketbook dictates. How fast do you want to go? How much money you got? I don't put any extra money into this other than the gas money it takes to run," he said, gesturing at his pickup.

Participants can show up, race and leave, while volunteers put in more than a full day's work. Some, 'they're on the course for five minutes then they're out of here;" others, "they're on this course all day in this hot weather.'

One of the most unusual cars yesterday was a 1973 Vega with 183,000 miles on the odometer, belonging to Bill Lloyd of Chester. Lloyd, a Du-Pont Co. employee, bought the car new and has been using it in Autocross since 1975

"It's been through numerous transmissions and engines," he said, referring to the notoriously shortlived Vega power plant.

"It's reasonably inexpensive and you don't have to work on the cars a lot unless you bring in one of the modifieds, or something."

Andrew Siff, owner of the Iron-horse Restaurant in Ashland, began the competition yesterday with his first run in his gray 1985 Mazda RX7. The Tennessee tag read: "1-ELVIS."

The Mazda was his daily driving car until last year. Now it's heavily modified and he brought it to yester-

day's event on a trailer.

"Andy looks like he's got a good run going," said the announcer over the portable public address system as Siff's Mazda roared back in front of the small crowd gathered along the runway at the course start.

Some of the cars following Siff's in the heat hit pylons - two-second penalties, or missed gates entirely, adding 10 seconds penalty time. Others slid off the course, slowing them

down but not adding penalty time.

Siff started autocross in 1991. "I guess it's a hobby," he said, laughing. I can't afford to go real racing. This sort of gives me a chance.'

The competition will be judged by SCCA rules, VMSC style, Andy Siff said.




