WHAT IS VMSC?

Since 1950 the Virginia Motor Sport Club has been a non-profit organization devoted to hosting Autocross and Road Rally events in Central Virginia. The club hosts an average of 12 autocrosses, 8 road rallies and several novice schools per year. Our membership roster boasts some of the top autocross drivers in the nation and the region. Most of our events are open to competitors regardless of membership status with a few events being members only, but membership has it's perks!

WHAT IS AUTOCROSS?

"Autocross" is a fun, yet competitive, nonspeed focused auto event that tests driver skills and vehicle handling. Autocross is also referred to as "SOLO" competition because one car negotiates a course against a timer, unlike door-to-door racing.



A course is laid out using orange traffic cones to mark the path the cars will take. These events are usually run on large parking lots or airfields with

good surfaces free of pot holes and as few permanent structures as possible. One driver at a time negotiates the course with times being determined electronically. Seconds are added to a competitors raw time for cones knocked down, with off courses resulting in a DNF (did not finish). Winning can be determined by 1/1000 of a second.

Some of the driver skills you will use to negotiate a successful autocross course are smooth transitions, hard braking, controlled cornering, lane changes and slaloms. It requires concentration, fast thinking, quick reaction times and the ability to push harder when every part of you mind tells you to lift of the gas. Put all that together with schools, learning to read a course, and driving to win or simply having fun, and you have a great sport.

We have *varying classes* so you can drive the car you take to work everyday, a slightly or heavily modified street car, or a dedicated competition car. Some vehicles that are not permitted are high profile SUV's, trucks, mini-vans, motorcycles, and go-carts

There are 10-12 events each season, run by men and women with several father/son and father/daughter teams as well as husband & wife teams. Family and friends are our spectator base and we occasionally have a local business-sponsored event once a year. We also have a members only event at the Shriner's ACCA Temple in Richmond, a few open events at VMP in Dinwiddie, and one race per year is designated as a charity event.

The best way to learn is to come out, tell us you are new, and we will hook you up with an experienced driver to mentor you through the day. As you come to more and more events you will make friends quickly and you'll experience the camaraderie of over 100 driving enthusiasts at any given race.

WHAT IS ROAD RALLY?

A Road Rally is a competitive precision driving

challenge in which a driver and a navigator make up a rally team. The challenge is to drive on time, arriving at multiple check points along the route neither early nor late. There are three types of rallies; Tour, Course and Great Race.

Drivers must be 18 years or older with a valid drivers license. **Navigators** must 18 years or have parents written permission. Navigators need the "3 R's" (Reading, 'Riting and 'Rithmetic).

Types of cars: any type of vehicle that has passed inspection, is registered, has 4 wheels and can carry 2 people. There is also a Novice Class and a Rally School at the beginning of each year, and there are always experienced drivers and navigators to help you along. With all that said, you'll have a great drive through scenic country sides, by historic land marks, through downtown, or wind along a peaceful river.

All in all it makes for a fun day for car enthusiast.
