

Seat belts are now the thing, as Gene Atkinson points out below in a bulletin which he distributed to all casualty adjustors. Take heed we don't want to loose any members.

SEAT BELTS

Many states now require automobile manufacturers to furnish seat belts as standard equipment on automobiles sold in the states. Automobile manufacturers are putting seat belts in all new automobiles.

The National Safety Council says their studies reveal that the use of seat belts will greatly reduce automobile fatalities and serious injuries resulting from automobile accidents.

The use of seat belts is, therefore, becoming a rule of conduct to be followed by drivers and passengers. Undoubtedly it will not be long before the courts will be holding that an ordinarily prudent person would use a seat belt that is in an automobile. Failure to do so could conceivably be considered an act of contributory negligence.

Note: In view of these developments, all statements taken from drivers or passengers should reveal whether or not the automobile was equipped with seat belts and, if the driver and passengers were using the seat belts at the time.
